Selects, checks, and assembles equipment		
Cardiac monitor/defibrillator	1	
Therapy electrode pads	1	
Therapy cable	1	
States Indications for Procedure	-	
Ventricular fibrillation or pulseless ventricular tachycardia	1	
States Contraindications for Procedure	-

Performs Procedure	-	
Applies personal protective equipment: gloves	1	
Verifies patient is in cardiac arrest (unconscious, pulseless, not breathing	1	
normally)		
If pulseless, begins CPR and ICCA	1	
Turns cardiac monitor/defibrillator on	1	
Attaches therapy pads to therapy cable and connects to cardiac	1	
monitor/defibrillator		
If necessary, clean and dry skin or remove excess chest hair with razor	1	
Applies pads in the anterior-lateral or anterior-posterior placement	1	
Assures safe environment – evaluates the risk of sparks, combustibles,	1	
oxygen enriched environment		
Selects desired energy: Adult: Per manufacturer's guidelines, Pediatric: 2	1	
J/kg (see Pediatric Resuscitation Card)		
Charges the monitor/defibrillator while continuing chest compressions.	1	
Verbalizes "all clear" and visually ensure that all individuals are clear of the	1	
patient, stretcher and any equipment connected to the patient		
Confirms ECG rhythm requires defibrillation and confirms available energy	1	
Presses the shock button to deliver shock to the patient	1	
Immediately resumes compressions	1	
Pre-charges defibrillator prior to 2-minute rhythm check	1	
Reassesses rhythm every two minutes	1	
For persistent ventricular fibrillation or pulseless ventricular tachycardia,	1	
administer second and subsequent shocks: Adult: second and subsequent		
doses should be equivalent or higher, Pediatric: 4 J/kg (See Pediatric		
Resuscitation Card)

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Failure to take or verbalize personal protective equipment
Failure to deliver shock in a timely manner
Failure to verify rhythm before delivering shock
Failure to ensure a safe environment before delivering shock
Failure to operate the defibrillator to deliver shock (does not use the machine properly)
Failure to demonstrate acceptable shock sequence
Failure to immediately resume chest compressions after shock delivered
Failure to observe the patient for desired effect and adverse side effects after delivering shock
Failure to manage the patient as a minimally competent Paramedic
Exhibits unacceptable affect with patient or other personnel
Uses or orders a dangerous or inappropriate intervention
Failure to achieve a score of 17 or greater
