SUBJECT: CRISIS ASSISTANCE RESPONSE AND ENGAGEMENT (CARE) PROGRAM

The CARE program is a Chicago Department of Public Health (CDPH) initiative under Region 11 EMS, composed of teams of EMS Clinicians (EMT level minimum requirement) and behavioral health professionals who respond to Chicagoans experiencing a mental health crisis. The program operates M-F from 1030-1600 (excluding city holidays) in Chicago Police Districts 1, 4, 6, 7, 8, 12, and 19 (see attached map).

CARE teams respond through OEMC dispatch, CPD assists, self-dispatch, proactive outreach, and follow-up. Upon patient contact, the team will provide a focused medical assessment and thorough behavioral health assessment. Patient disposition is tailored to the patient's needs and includes providing resources, transporting to alternate destinations, and transporting to emergency departments. For emergency department transports, CARE teams will select the destination most appropriate for patient needs and provide a prenotification call. Online medical control of CARE teams is provided directly from the CARE Program Medical Directors.

Currently, there is no process for Chicago Fire Department (CFD) EMS clinicians to transfer care of patients to the CARE team. When CFD EMS clinicians have made patient contact, and a CARE team is on scene, CFD will follow the Region 11 <u>Initiation of Patient Care</u> policy. If the patient is stable with no medical issues, cooperative, and patient preference is a CARE team assessment, CFD must adhere to the Region 11 <u>Consent and Refusal of EMS</u> Service policy with a refusal documented and called into online medical control.



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
BUREAU OF BEHAVIORAL HEALTH Crisis Assistance Response and Engagement Program (CARE)

OUR MISSION

The CARE program works to ensure that Chicagoans experiencing a mental health crisis are assisted on-site by teams of behavioral health professionals and are offered resources to address additional unmet health and social needs.

CARE resources are focused on Chicago neighborhoods with the highest need for mental health resources. CDPH partners with the Office of Emergency Management and Communications to integrate behavioral health professionals into the City's 911 response system.

WHERE WE OPERATE



CARE teams currently operate in Police Districts 1, 4, 6, 7, 8, 12, and 19.

HOW IT WORKS

- · A Public Health-led staffing model services 911 calls that require a behavioral health intervention. The responders include a CDPH Mental Health Crisis Clinician and a CDPH Emergency Medical Technician.
- Safe spaces and alternate destinations for shelter are provided to individuals experiencing a mental or behavioral health crisis.
- Mental health professionals have been added to Chicago's 911 Call Center to consult and support emergency responses.
- A Citywide/Special Cases team provides coverage across the city and is not limited to any geographic area and responds to complex behavioral cases around the city through referrals.
